THE VIRTUE OF FAITH

This Sunday's readings were chosen to lead us to reflect on the virtue of faith: to ask ourselves what faith really is, and how we can increase our faith.

The first reading, from the prophet Habakkuk, introduces us to this idea. Habakkuk was sent to preach to the Jewish people at a difficult time, when they were tempted to lose faith because they were being persecuted by neighboring governments. God sent him to speak His word to them. In the same way, God sends Habakkuk into our lives today, asking us to listen to what He is saying.

Habakkuk begins by representing the people before God: "How long, O Lord, am I to cry for help while you do not listen? I cry out to you 'Oppression!' but you do not intervene." This was the mood of the people then, and it may also be our mood when we bring our own anxieties and concerns before God. Like the people of Israel, we may sometimes feel God is not answering.

But God replies with words of hope: "Write the vision down, inscribe it on tablets to be easily read, since this vision is for its own time only: eager for its own fulfilment, it does not deceive; if it comes slowly, wait, for come it will, without fail. And the just man will live by his faith."

God tells the Jews, and us today, that what He asks of us is faith. Faith means having a trusting attitude toward God no matter what is happening in our lives. In moments of personal disappointment or disaster—in struggles such as divorce, the loss of a job, or other hardships—God still wants us to know He is with us. Faith is confidence in God, even in those times. So we must ask: are we men and women of faith? Do we trust God in all circumstances? Habakkuk reminds us that "the just one lives by his faith." More than anything else, the Christian life is a matter of faith.

With that in mind, we turn to this Sunday's Gospel, where Jesus speaks directly about faith. The apostles said to Him: "Increase our faith!" Jesus answers with an image: "If you have the faith the size of a mustard seed, you will say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you." Jesus often spoke with hyperbole, or exaggerated language. Here He is telling us that even the tiniest amount of faith can lead to miraculous things in our lives.

How can we increase our trust in God? I suggest three ways:

- 1. **Prayer** To grow in faith, we must pray. Prayer is spending time in God's presence, building a relationship with Him. Just as a husband and wife come to trust one another by spending time together, so we come to trust God by being with Him in prayer.
- 2. Scripture Reading the Word of God strengthens faith, helping us to hear His voice and see His faithfulness.
- 3. **Practice** To become stronger in faith, we must practice it. Trust grows by being lived; if we never practice trusting God, we will not learn to rely on Him.

Later in the Gospel, Jesus also warns that too often we want to use God for our own purposes. Instead of being His servants, we want Him to be ours. But discipleship means the opposite: we are God's servants. Jesus teaches that, like the servant returning from the fields, we should say: "We are merely servants; we have done no more than our duty."

This is the true attitude of faith. God does not owe us anything; rather, we owe everything to Him. We trust in Him, we follow Him, and we live as His disciples—not because He must reward us, but because He loves us. Faith is living with this awareness.
