#### **AUTHORITY AND CONSCIENCE**

Our society today often experiences tension between authority and conscience. On one hand, we recognise the need for leadership to prevent chaos. On the other, we value the protection of individual conscience, believing that each person must ultimately determine what is good and what is bad.

Yet, how difficult it is to make these two voices - the voice of conscience and the voice of authority - enter into genuine dialogue and mutual understanding. Too often, we draw a hard line between them, placing each in soundproof chambers so they never meet.

But is this the only model we can follow? Is there a way for these two voices to come together and collaborate rather than compete? A brief passage from an article by Michael Konrad, a theologian and one of my confreres, may shed some light. It reflects on the legacy of St. John Henry Newman, who was recently given by Pope Leo the title *Doctor of the Church* - an honour bestowed on those whose teachings are recognised as especially inspiring for the Church and the world.

Twenty-five years after Newman's conversion, the First Vatican Council promulgated the dogma of papal infallibility, and Newman found himself faced with a new problem. Some Catholics interpreted the dogma to mean that the Pope was infallible in all his statements. Newman reaffirmed the importance of infallibility, but without forgetting the other side of the coin, namely the moral conscience of the individual. Without denying the Church's authority to teach on matters of faith and morals, the Cardinal stated: "If I am obliged to bring religion into after-dinner toasts, I shall drink – to the Pope, if you please – still, to Conscience first, and to the Pope afterwards."

For Newman, moral conscience and authority are not mutually exclusive, but mutually dependent. A person who sincerely seeks the good and is aware of their own limitations cannot but desire to find an authority that can guide them in their search. Conversely, an authority such as that of the Church, which has no means of physical coercion at its disposal, can only appeal to the conscience of the individual, hoping that they will recognise the truth. For Newman, the Church and moral conscience are two vicars of Christ, whose task is to assist the individual in their search for the will of God.

To foster a true dialogue between the voice of conscience and the voice of authority in the Church (the Pope, the bishops, and the teachings of the Catechism), we must first recognize that they share a common origin. Both our conscience and the authority of the Church are 'vicars of Christ', deriving from the same Creator in whom we live, move, and have our being.

Recognising this requires effort on both sides. On one hand, we must allow our hearts to be challenged by what the Church's authority teaches - without prejudice or preconceived ideas - and approach it with honesty and sincerity. On the other hand, we must also examine what our conscience perceives as true, right, and just, moving beyond superficial impressions and reactions to reach the deepest part of ourselves, the place where the voice of conscience truly speaks.

This work cannot be done alone, as St John Henry Newman often reminds us both in his writings and his life. As Prof Konrad says: "One cannot understand Newman's spirit without considering the community he belonged to: from St. Philip Neri he learned that, for a member of the Oratory, the place of sanctification is first and foremost community life – not so much following an abstract rule, but loving real people, with all their faults".

The fellowship of the Church accompanies us, helping us to open our eyes and ears so that we may see and hear the Truth - the only reality that can bring unity to the life of both the individual and society.
