I Will Be Tomorrow

The most characteristic element of the week from 17th to 23rd December, not to be confused with the novena, is the presence of the so-called "O" antiphons, both in the Liturgy of the Hours as antiphons to the Magnificat, and in the celebration of the Eucharist as verses of singing the Gospel. They are called "O" antiphons because they always begin with the vocative form of "O", followed by one of the titles attributed to Jesus. They are seven very ancient prayers which entered the liturgy around the ninth century. They are composed of biblical passages, taken almost literally from the Latin version of St. Jerome's Bible, and develop a particular biblical theme derived from the title with which they begin: O Sapientia, O Adonai, O Radix Iesse, O Clavis David, O Oriens, O Rex gentium, O Emmanuel. The initial letters of Latin titles, arranged from last to first, form the acrostic "ERO CRAS" ("I will be tomorrow"): it is Christ's promise in the imminence of His coming.

In ancient times these invocations were performed with great solemnity in cathedrals and monasteries. Even the liturgical reform of the Second Vatican Council wanted to keep them, both for the rich scriptural content and for the very ancient and uninterrupted tradition which has kept them intact up to us.

Every antiphon always has a reference to the past, present, and future. Therefore, in each antiphon, it is as if a small microcosm were enclosed: it is a question of looking at events or characteristics linked to God's way of acting in the past to invoke His coming in the present in the post-Easter church that we are, in anticipation of the eschatological fulfilment in the final and definitive coming of Christ in glory. In this way the liturgy of the Church proclaims that redemption and salvation have been given by Christ once and for all, but at the same time we do not fully enjoy the effects of redemption. We are an "already", but also in a "not yet". In this sense we are still waiting. We are not waiting for the incarnation of Christ, or for the coming of the Messiah for our redemption. However, we live in the ardent desire of Christ not so much for Him to come and save us, but for Him to become the centre of our lives and thus allow us to fully enjoy redemption.

The "O" antiphons project us towards the fulfilment that awaits us with His second coming in the glory. It is a question of the way of proceeding of the entire Advent liturgy which certainly does not place us in expectation of the Messiah of the people of Israel of the Old Testament but makes us aware of the expectation of Him who is placed today in our lives, as a Church who lives the last times, awaiting his definitive return. It is a question of an active awaiting and of the adherence of our faith to the One who has come, but for whom we always wait until He comes to be with us forever. These antiphons underline even more forcefully that the Child placed in the manger is truly the God we have awaited and desired: He is Eternal Wisdom, our Lord, the long-awaited Messiah, the Branch of David's lineage, the King, the true Sun rising, the God with us, the Emmanuel. He fulfilled the expectations of the peoples with His incarnation and above all in the paschal mystery; and finally, we wait for Him so that everyone can know him as Wisdom, Lord and King.

The "O" antiphons are a source of inspiration and prayer to invoke the coming of the Lord and thus guide us in the days of preparation for Christmas.
