# The Courage To Admit Your Weaknesses

There is an episode of the Gospel, usually read during Lent, that strikes me every time I come across it. It is the story of Jesus healing a man born blind. What surprises me is not just the miracle performed by Jesus, but what happens before, particularly the way the man approaches him.

While he is sitting at the side of the road, someone tells the man born blind that there is a man who is curing a lot of people from their diseases and he is passing by. As soon as he hears these words, his desire to be cured is so kindled in his heart, that he begins to cry, so loudly that the crowd, "scolds him and tells him to keep guiet", but he shouts louder and louder: "Son of David, have pity on me". Jesus, immediately, having perceived his insistence, cures him.

While the cry of this poor man seems to embarrass and annoy the crowd, Jesus looks at him with admiration: that man had the courage to admit his weaknesses. He was neither afraid nor ashamed of his condition. With honesty and sincerity he presented himself to Jesus as he was, weak and needy. This episode always reminds me of the importance of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Maybe the greatest obstacle that prevents us to savour the taste of God's mercy in this Sacrament, is that our society revolves too much around us "pretending to be ok". It is a covering up culture, where the real elephant in the room is that we are not ok on our own. We are always in need and will always be. Particularly in need of forgiveness.

At the same time, we have to admit that we are all uncomfortable with our limits and weaknesses. But there is just one thing worse than not being perfect: it is not to be forgiven. And while being perfect is impossible, to be forgiven is actually possible. Jesus invented the Sacrament of Reconciliation to make the impossible possible: cancel all our sins and give us the experience of true freedom. Yes, we will sin again, we will experience again the sadness of our weaknesses, but he will never lose patience. He will always be there in the confessional, waiting for us to cry to him all our needs and respond with his embrace.

Last week I had the chance to go to confession. I remember how I felt before and after. Before I was weighed down with the awareness of all my limits and errors. Afterwards I felt free and definitely better. Something mysteriously real happened during that confession. It was so real that I just went and visited a family, because I felt the need to share with someone else the joy that filled my heart. Allow me to encourage you in this time of Lent to savour the taste of God's mercy, to give him a chance to enter into your heart through the Sacrament of Confession, and give you that joy that we all need in order to live our daily life.


