The Path of Lent

With Ash Wednesday we begin Lent. It will be forty days during which the Father, who is rich in mercy, wants to make us more like his Son. "Now is the favourable time; this is the day of salvation," says St Paul (2 Cor. 6:2).

We begin Lent with a specific sign (the ashes) which orientates our whole journey towards Easter. The priest asks us to remember that we are dust, and he places some ashes on our heads.

Why does the Church begin the Lenten journey with such a serious expression? Because we become Christians and we are converted to Christ only if we become aware of our condition as sinners. Jesus said that he came not for the righteous, but for the sinners. The words that the priest says during the distribution of the ashes are taken literally from the words of God. They are His words to the first man and woman, as they are driven away from the garden, the place of their friendship with God himself: "Remember that you are dust, and you must return to dust" (Gen. 3:19). Without God, our life can only be dust. During Lent we are called to become aware that we are estranged from the One who is the source of Life. St Paul tells us: "The appeal we make in the name of Christ is: to be reconciled with God" (2 Cor. 5:20). The good news is that God wants this reconciliation to happen, He wants us to rediscover our relationship with Him. For this reason Confession during Lent is of fundamental importance, because it allows us to truly welcome the Lord.

Perhaps someone could say to himself: "But I have not done anything serious; my sins are daily trifles: I am even ashamed to confess them because they are always the same". Let me explain with an example. If you catch a bird and you want to keep it from flying away, it doesn't matter if you tie it with a string or an iron chain. Both prevent it from taking flight. We must listen to the Lord, because even small attachments to sin prevent us from being fully His.

In the Gospel, Jesus indicates three acts which help us to be reconciled with God. They are almsgiving, prayer, and fasting. Jesus did not choose them by chance. They are acts that truly express and bring about the conversion of the heart.

The first - almsgiving - heals our relationship with others, because it educates us to justice and charity. The second - prayer - puts our relationship with God in the right place because it introduces us to the most intimate truth of our person: we are beggars before God, we need to ask for everything. The third - fasting - brings order to ourselves, since it educates us to live by following Jesus' invitation to the disciples to abandon themselves confidently to the Providence of God, without any anxiety about material food.

These three suggestions, together with the confession of our sins, can accompany us during Lent, in order to celebrate Easter as people who are truly free.

Rules for Ash Wednesday and Lent

Roman Catholics must abstain from meat on all Fridays during Lent. On Ash Wednesday Roman Catholics must fast and abstain from meat. Fasting means that they may eat one full meal, and they may eat two small meals as well. The two smaller meals must not equal one full meal. There are exceptions to these rules. Those from ages 18-59 must fast. If you are younger than 18 or older than 59, you do not have to fast. Women who are pregnant or nursing also do not have to fast. Furthermore, if you have a health problem that makes fasting unhealthy for you, you do not have to fast.

Lent at St Edward's - During Lent Mass on Fridays at St Edward's will be at 7pm (instead of 10am) preceded by Stations of the Cross at 6.30pm. After Mass there will be a CAFOD Lenten Supper on each Friday except March 13th when there will be a Lenten lunch instead from 12.30pm -1.30pm. All suppers and lunch will be £5 (£1 for children).
