We belong exclusively to God

Today's Gospel wants to teach us how we Christians have to consider political society, the State, and what our duties are towards it.

The Lord therefore says, 'Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God.' Caesar represents every legitimate political authority. The Lord's words are best identified by placing them in the context of a serious problem that troubled the conscience of many of Jesus' fellow citizens. The fact that even the Jews, as citizens of the Roman Empire, had to recognise the power of Rome by paying taxes to the imperial tax authorities, did not fail to arouse perplexity and resistance. For the Jews, by recognising the ruling emperor, it challenged their fundamental belief that the Lord is the only ruler of Israel. Let's not forget - which is difficult for us to understand today - that the attribution of divine characters to the king, to the emperor, made recognition by the Jews even more difficult.

So how does Jesus place himself in this situation? He doesn't teach, 'don't pay taxes; don't recognise human political power.' On the contrary. For Jesus, political power performs a service; it has a function, and it ensures goods things we can enjoy. It is therefore right that it should be fully recognised.

But Jesus' answer is not limited to this. It makes an addition of decisive importance, '(Repay) to God what belongs to God.' What is God's and what must be returned to Him? Ourselves. The human person belongs exclusively to his Creator. Jesus in another context had said that the first commandment is, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your strength.'

If we now consider Jesus' answer as a whole, we understand that on the one hand Jesus reminds us of the duties we have as citizens of a State, first of all to pay taxes. But on the other hand, from these words of Jesus political power comes out radically reduced. It loses any connotation of absolute sovereignty: only God is our absolute sovereign. Political power is not the ultimate referent of human life. God alone is the ultimate goal of our life.

These words constitute a turning point in the history of our Western society that it is no exaggeration to describe as revolutionary. Before Jesus, it was always thought among all peoples that the laws of the State derive directly from God himself.

The Christian community has a positive impact on the civil community, according to the teaching given to us by Jesus in the Gospel. Our citizenship is in the Heaven, of course; however, this does not suppress our duties towards the earthly city.


