Creation, Earthquakes and Mystery

I think it is true to say that the whole of Creation remains a mystery despite the efforts of scientists and theoreticians to winkle out every fact and statistic associated with it. It is still a mystery of which only a fraction is understood by the finite minds of the human race. I believe very much in the goodness of God's Creation but I find that His Creation is never more mysterious as when *natural disasters* occur as has happened in the recent earthquakes to hit Turkey and Northern Syria.

As I ponder this phenomena I find there is no easy answer especially to the question often posed by people as to, "Why does God let these things happen?" It is one of those questions which can be applied to any difficult personal or international problem.

All I can suggest is an answer I heard many years ago that has helped me understand this. It is one which suggests that at the fall of Adam (Humankind) it was not just humanity that fell from perfection but the whole world; snakes would bite; bees and wasps would sting; meteorites would hit the earth and the elements would be subject to their own ways.

What I do know is that we should all help to relieve suffering wherever we see it and governments should act to help other Nations in need. It is also our duty to pray for those who suffer as a result of these elemental disasters. However, there is one other disaster which has gone unnoticed and that is the Spiritual earthquake which has hit Western Europe! There are many who lie buried under the rubble of their misspent lives of unbelief; who have been trapped under the weight of their materialistic and God-less behaviour. These people cry out and wait to be rescued. We need to respond to their need and gather ourselves together and provide the Teams necessary to go out and rescue them from the suffocation of their crumbling houses built on sand. Here is our Mission and here is the totality of meaning to the work of the Red Cross under whose banner we, as Christians, go forward to the rescue. It may take a while to dig deep enough for that rescue to take place and there will be a lot of time as we try to listen as to where the cry for help comes. The damage which has been done by the spiritual earthquake has fatal results in the death of a Christian soul. But rescue is at hand in the empathy we should have for the sinner, for we realise that but for the grace of God, we, too, can so easily walk away from him and crumble under the weight of our option for self. We are called not to despair in times of need. We can be small beacons of hope to set the way again before others that they may re-join the firm ground and continue back again in God's Holy Church towards the Kingdom where all mystery will be revealed.

I finish with some words by Timothy Radcliffe OP which I have found helpful in trying to live within the mystery of creation, and of the commission to serve and respect that crown of creation which we call humankind.

We dare to set out on this perilous path, endure moments of turmoil, and even crisis, because we trust that God is there, in all the mess, to bless us. We may not sometimes love well, go astray, and suffer. But God is with us to make pour lives fertile. So we have no need to be afraid. We can have courage. (What is the point of being a Christian? Timothy Radciffe p.110)


