Holy Cross and Our Lady

Two important feasts are celebrated by the Church in September. They are the *Exaltation of the Holy Cross*, on 14th September, and *Our Lady of Sorrow*, on the following day.

The first feast is solemnly celebrated in our Holy Cross church in Eastleigh. Saint Helena, the mother of the Roman emperor Constantine, went to the Holy Land at the beginning of the 4th century to find the True Cross where Jesus was hanged. Tradition says that she managed to spot the cross, in the mount of Calvary. She wanted to erect two churches there, which comprised Constantine's Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre. Between 13th and 14th September 335 the two churches of the Martyrion and the Anastasis (Resurrection) were inaugurated.

The relics of the True Cross were already scattered throughout the Christian world at the time of the Catecheses (348-350) of St Cyril of Jerusalem. In 614 the relic of the True Cross had been taken as spoils of war by the Persians. However, in 628 it was recovered thanks to the victory of the Emperor Heraclius, who on his return to Constantinople celebrated his triumph on 14th September of that year and then returned the relic to the Holy Sepulchre.

This feast helps us to remember that eternity in glory and the salvation of the human race pass through the cross, through which Our Lord conquered sin and death, against all the world's expectations. There can be no Christianity without the cross, which is the premise of the Resurrection and which has made the faithful of all times discover the meaning of suffering on earth. We read in the Catechism, 'Suffering can now configure us to Him and unite us with His redemptive Passion' (CCC 1505).

The second feast helps us to remember the seven sorrows of our Blessed Mother, St Mary: the prophecy of Simeon, the flight into Egypt, the loss of the holy child at Jerusalem for three days, meeting with Jesus on his way to Calvary, standing at the foot of the cross, Jesus being taken from the cross, and the burial of Christ.

St Mary always knew that Jesus would die and hoped he would rise again. She kept this hope with great fidelity. Despite this, she still mourned the crucifixion and cried deeper than we have ever cried. St Mary's sorrow was a deep sorrow. In the Gospel we can read that Simeon compares this sorrow to a sword that pierces the soul. St Mary was a perfect creature because she never sinned, and because of her perfection, she loved more deeply than us. Because of this love, she felt the sorrow of loss more acutely than we did.

We can only imagine how Jesus felt when he saw his grieving mother. It certainly caused him some pain, but it was also a great support. The rest of the world might be cruel and selfish, but his mother's face was the only place his eyes could rest.

St Mary's sorrow was not a hopeless sorrow. She knew with some hope that Jesus would rise from the dead. Her hope did not stop her from experiencing acute pain, nor did the pain prevent her from expecting his resurrection. We can put all our sorrows in Our Lady's hands, because she is really able to suffer with us and to accompany us in our trials.

Over the next few weeks, a card reader will be installed in the church foyers at Holy Cross, St Edward & St Andrew, to start with. Contactless payments are touchfree. There is no need to type in your PIN (unless your card requires it) or hand over your card. Simply select the amount you wish to give from the options on the screen. When the screen prompts for payment, hold your card over the reader, listen for the beep, and your payment is done.

Gift Aiding your contactless donations: You only need to register to Gift Aid once per card. Once registered, the card reader in the church will recognise it the next time you make a gift aided payment. When you donate using your contactless card without Gift Aid, no personal information is collected.
