PRAY THE ROSARY FOR THE END OF THE PANDEMIC

We are in the month of May, a month traditionally dedicated to the Virgin Mary and the praying of the rosary. This year Pope Francis is encouraging Catholics across the globe to pray the Rosary for an end to the pandemic during May.

We can take this opportunity to deepen our understanding about the importance of praying the rosary. I would like to stress three points.

Why do we pray the mysteries?

The prayers that compose the Rosary are arranged in sets of ten "Hail Marys", called decades. Each decade is preceded by one "Our Father" and traditionally followed by one "Glory Be". During recitation of each set, thought is given to one of the Mysteries of the Rosary, which recall events in the lives of Jesus and of Mary.

We are called to meditate these mysteries because in those stories we can find our story. Let's take the first joyful mystery, where we meditate on the annunciation. The angel Gabriel brought to Mary the good news, that God would become flesh through her "yes". Isn't it also our story? Yes, it is. God today can become flesh through our "yes", like he did 2000 years ago. In all the 20 mysteries that we are asked to meditate we can find our story and the stories of those we love: stories of pain, glory, joy and light. When we reflect on the four sets of mysteries (sorrowful, joyful, glorious and luminous), we don't reflect just on a past event, but on an event that happened, is happening and will happen to us as well.

Why "through" Mary?

When we pray the Rosary, we pray fifty times the "Hail Mary". Why do we have to go through Mary, if we want to reach God? Wouldn't be better to pray God directly? The answer is simple and it comes from the central point of our faith: the incarnation. We believe in a God that from the day of the first Christmas makes himself visible through human beings. Therefore if we want to reach him we can't avoid flesh and bones, we have to respect his way of communicating himself: through a human face. We need, in a word, "intercessors". Saints, and especially Mary, Queen of the Saints, is the best intercessor God has given to us.

Why is it so repetitive?

Finally, why are the prayers of the rosary always the same? Why don't we change and pray with different words every time? I would answer this question with a quote of an Italian poet, Cesare Pavese, "The surest, and the quickest, way for us to arouse the sense of wonder is to stare, unafraid, at a single object. Suddenly—miraculously—it will look like something we have never seen before".
