REAWAKEN OUR SENSE OF WONDER

Last week, during the weekdays, we read the Gospel in which Jesus tells the people who came to listen to him that in order to enter the Kingdom of Heaven, they need to become like children. You can call it a simple phrase, but it's the kind of thing that, the more you think about it, the more you realise how deep it is. And the more you do that, the more you realise what it means to become like children. Of the many reasons why Jesus asks us to become like children, one in particular became clear to me after the *Come and See Club* last week.

As many of you will know, Come and See is a week-long club that we organise for children during the half-term and summer holidays. This time, on the Tuesday, we visited the New Forest Wildlife Park. It is a small zoo where you can find different types of animals, mainly forest animals, but not only. It was a wonderful day! This was certainly due to the beauty of the animals we saw, from the majesty of the adult deer to the elegance of the otter's movements. However, what struck me most was how amazed the children were to see the animals. The younger the children were, the greater their sense of wonder. I particularly remember the bright eyes and dazzling smile of an eight-year-old girl standing in front of her favourite animal, the snowy owl (the same one you can see in the Harry Potter films). I also remember the joy of a seven-year-old boy when he finally saw the wildcat. And not to mention when we passed by the fawn enclosure where the children could stroke them!

Looking at the sense of wonder these children had, I began to understand one of the many meanings of Jesus' words in the Gospel: that we need to become like children to enter the Kingdom of Heaven. Becoming like children means reawakening our sense of wonder at the world around us. This helps us to realise that everything we have is a gift. We realise that the beauty of the world around us is a gift from God. But why? Why is a sense of wonder so important? Because wonder gives rise to gratitude. If we no longer allow ourselves to be amazed by anything, we take everything for granted, making it more difficult to be grateful to God for His gifts. However, if we rekindle our sense of wonder at the things around us, thanking the Lord for the beauty of his gifts in our lives will come more naturally. It's just like the little girl who was amazed and full of wonder when she saw a family of wallabies hopping alongside her.
