CARNIVAL

During this period, one thing that normally happened in my region in Italy close to Venice, but does not exist here in England, is the carnival celebration. The motto during the celebration was: "*A carnevale ogni scherzo vale*". Clearly, the English translation does not rhyme, but it means that at carnival, any kind of joke goes. This became an opportunity to play all kinds of pranks, even some terrible ones. One of the nastiest pranks was to break a stink bomb in a busy place, such as a shop or at school. We would buy vials of a yellowish liquid, and when the vial broke, it would smell so badly that it made you want to run away.

Yet Carnival was not only a time for pranks, but also for beauty, floats and fantasy. There were families who built floats with huge figures every year. As they paraded through the town, they threw sweets and we children ran around like crazy to collect as many as possible.

The origins of carnival in Venice and the surrounding area are very ancient, but among the various reasons for its creation, one was the fact that during that period people could wear masks and thus, in anonymity, social differences disappeared, so it was a way of being on the same level for at least a few days. The most commonly used mask for the occasion was the *Bautta*: a black tricorne hat and an expressionless white mask to emphasise the equality between people.

Obviously, this also had negative consequences, such as abuse, because by wearing masks, people could commit minor crimes without being recognised. In any case, the most important feature of carnival is that it is a celebration that precedes Lent. The name itself has a Latin origin, emphasising the consumption of meat (*carne*) before the abstinence of Lent.

Another typical Carnival foods in my region are *i crostoli* and *e fritoe* (Venetian spoken), two desserts that are only prepared during this period and are very sweet, to put on a little more weight before the fast on Ash Wednesday.

What more can I say? This year, Lent begins very early, next Wednesday (Ash Wednesday), so we have now only the next three days to celebrate a little before the rigours of Lent. But the good news is that we do not need to wear masks, because Jesus revealed to us that we have one Father, so we are all brothers and sisters at the same level, despite all the differences that are present in our multicultural community. It is precisely the unity among us that makes even the rigorous period of Lent easier.

Message about the closure of St Swithun Wells Church

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Last weekend at St Swithun Wells Church I read to the congregation the letter from Bishop Philip announcing his decision to close St Swithun Wells Church, Fair Oak, for regular public worship. I know that this news has brought sadness to many, not only within that community but across our whole parish family of six churches. In his letter of 26th January 2026, the Bishop explains that, "after a sustained period of prayer, consultation, and careful consideration... I have taken the difficult decision to close St Swithun Wells Church... for regular public worship."

He is clear that this decision "is not a judgement on the faith, generosity, or commitment of those who have worshipped in this church over many years," but reflects "the pastoral reality of the parish today and the need to plan responsibly for the future."

The **last Mass at St Swithun Wells Church** will be celebrated on **Saturday 14th March at 5pm**. I warmly invite parishioners from across the parish to join us on that day as we give thanks for the many graces received there: baptisms, marriages, funerals, and countless quiet moments of prayer.

The Bishop reminds us that "the Church is not the building alone, but the living Body of Christ, gathered around the Eucharist and sent out on mission: 'You yourselves are God's building' (1 Corinthians 3:9)" Please take time to read the Bishop's full letter on our parish website. Let us pray for one another, especially for those most affected, and ask the Lord to guide us as we continue to build up His Church together. With my prayers and blessing, **Fr Raffaele**.

Rules for Ash Wednesday & Lent

On **Ash Wednesday (18th February)** Roman Catholics must fast and abstain from meat. Fasting means reducing considerably the amount of food we eat (e.g. having just one meal) and abstinence means abstaining from eating meat. The law of fasting applies to anyone aged 18-60. The law of abstinence applies to those who are over 14. Roman Catholics must also abstain from eating meat on all Fridays during Lent. Please read the time of Ash Wednesday Masses on the back page.

Lenten Lunch in aid of CAFOD will be commencing on **Friday 27th February and every Friday in Lent at St Edward's**, from 12 Noon until 1.30pm. All donations will go to CAFOD'S funds helping all who are in need due to famine, climate change, wars and disasters. Your support will be greatly appreciated.

Weekday Masses & Eucharistic Adoration

One of the pillars of Lent is prayer.

A simple way to do this is to attend Mass on weekdays or to participate in one of our Eucharistic Adorations. On Tuesdays in St Edward for example, there is Mass at 6pm with Eucharistic Adoration afterwards. On Wednesdays there is Mass in Holy Cross at 9.30am followed by Eucharistic Adoration. At St Joseph there is Mass every Thursday at 6pm and Eucharistic Adoration one hour before from 5pm-6pm. At OLQA there is Eucharistic Adoration (after Mass) at 12.30pm every Thursday.
