God's absence

This Sunday's liturgy offers us the parable of the tenants to whom a landowner lends the vineyard which he has planted, and then goes away (Mt 21:33-43). This is how the loyalty of these tenants is tested: the vineyard is entrusted to them, they are to take care of it, make it bear fruit and deliver its harvest to the owner. When the time comes to harvest the grapes, the landlord sends his servants to pick the fruit. However, the vineyard tenants assume a possessive attitude. They do not consider themselves to be simple supervisors, but rather landowners, and they refuse to hand over the harvest. They mistreat the servants, to the point of killing them. The landowner is patient with them. He sends more servants, larger in number than the previous ones, but the result is the same. In the end, he patiently decides to send his own son. But those tenants, prisoners to their own possessive behaviour, also kill the son, reasoning that, in this way, they would have the inheritance. At the end, the owner comes to the vineyard, destroys the tenants and gives the vineyard to others.

It is a lengthy and quite intricate parable, but for a good reason: in symbolic language it contains the whole history of human salvation. It first looks backwards to the election and formation of Israel by God and to the long line of prophets he sent to his people, culminating in Jesus. It portrays graphically the long history of the brutal rejection of the prophets (including Jesus himself) by the leaders of Israel. And it then looks forward at Jesus' Passion and death at the hands of his own people, with the final triumph of the Resurrection and of the Second Coming.

I would like to focus on the very beginning of the parable, when it is said that, after all his detailed planning and successful labour to plant the vineyard, the landowner went into another country. The key to the whole story, what makes all its events possible, is the owner's physical absence from the scene. The theme of God's absence to man's senses is one of the structural features of all Scripture and all human experience. It is not rare in the Scripture and in our best human artistic expressions to read questions like, "If God is real, why cannot we see him?" or "Why is he absent?" How can we understand this absence? Is it true that God is absent from the world? Is God's absence

The Gospel gives the best answer to all these questions when it says that God is absent because WE should become the eyes, hands and heart of God in this world. By giving us his own animating and sanctifying Spirit, Christ has implanted in us a wholly new life, his joy and unity with the Father, the love of the Holy Trinity. We have all we need to make God visible to all through our thoughts, words and deeds!


