WITH GREAT GIFT COMES GREAT RESPONSIBILITY

A generation longing for belonging. If someone asked me to describe today's youth - the so-called Gen Z - in a nutshell, those are the words I would use.

During my recent travels across Europe to visit the missions of our Fraternity, I encountered many young adults. From Norway to Spain, and from the Czech Republic to Germany and the United Kingdom, they all seem to share the same deep need to feel connected, accepted, and part of a community. It is a powerful desire for relationship, purpose, and an identity beyond oneself - a longing felt most acutely during times of isolation or transition. Perhaps this is the fruit of a generation that spent its formative teenage years in the shadow of COVID-19. It is a yearning that drives them to seek inclusion, but one that can also lead to deep loneliness or anxiety if it remains unmet.

One of the greatest gifts the Catholic Church can offer a human being is Baptism. This gift directly addresses that longing for belonging. Through Baptism, God offers a promise: no matter what happens, no matter what job you hold or where you live, you will always have a place to call home: the Church. It is home, because it is the place where love and truth meet.

I was baptised when I was only four months old. Looking back forty-three years later, I see that this promise has been fulfilled. I have lived in Italy and England, spent time in Austria, and stayed for a month in Brazil. My travels take me across Europe to many different countries, yet I have never felt homeless. Wherever I have gone, whether for a short stay or a long season, a community of believers was already there, waiting for me. They offered the kind of love and truth my heart was made for - not a cheap imitation, but a truth that is deep, profound, and thought-provoking, and a love that is transforming, selfless, and truly satisfying.

When we celebrate a Baptism, there is a moment that always fills me with wonder: the lighting of the small candle from the great Paschal candle. The Paschal candle is large because it represents the long line of people who believed in Christ before us. Their light shines brightly because they are not truly gone; they represent a community that stretches back to the first companions Jesus chose - the twelve apostles - and continues through the centuries to us today. By lighting that small candle, godparents accept both the gift and the responsibility of this belonging. It is as if they are saying: "We say yes to the invitation to belong to a community greater than ourselves - one that will never abandon us".

We, too, hold the responsibility not to break this holy chain. We are the ones to whom this light has been entrusted. We must keep it burning brightly so that future generations might find, through our witness, a community that leads them to the One who alone can fill the restless heart.
