Our Time Is Growing Short

"Brothers: our time is growing short", St Paul tells us this Sunday, reminding us of the importance of time, of the fact that time is short, so we are called to a wise and therefore correct use of it.

But what is time? Time can basically be thought of in two ways: as time that passes, that flows (seconds, hours, days, years), or as favourable time, opportune time.

There is no need to talk much about the passing of time, we are all too familiar with it. Who has never missed the train? Who has never arrived too early for an appointment (at the dentist's, the doctor's...) and had to wait a little before their turn? In short, the flowing time is closely linked to our clock, linked to the timing of the events in which we are involved, so from sunrise to sunset we all experience the flow of time.

What, on the other hand, is favourable time? It is the time that is given to us to live well, to be happier, it is the opportunities that are given to us to be holier. But when does this favourable time come? Yesterday has already passed, and we probably missed the opportunity to be holier; tomorrow we do not know what will be waiting for us, we may already no longer be on this earth, so the favourable time is today, it is now, it is exactly this instant!

The favourable time to love Jesus is now! Are you washing the dishes? Wash them for Jesus! Are you doing the laundry? Do it for Jesus! You are writing a computer program, do it with the awareness that it is for the glory of God... I could go on and on by listing the possibilities and actions that a person can do, but the crux of what I want to emphasise is that we can always offer up to God what we are doing, what we are living, and thus do what we are doing for His glory, for the conversion of sinners, for the sanctification of ourselves and of God's people.

Nowadays people, especially young people, spend hours, many hours a day on social media, watching trivial videos or posting their own photos and comments. Actually, even the use of social media can be useful for the glory of God, but if done *cum grano salis*, that is, in an intelligent way. Wasting a lot of time watching videos or looking at photos that are perhaps even funny, but serve no purpose, is literally just a waste of time.

In short, time is given to us to live it to the full, not to waste it, and the best way to do this is to use it appropriately, that is, to do what is asked of us by living it as if we were doing it for Jesus. Even rest itself can be done for Jesus, so that we can recover our strength and be able to resume work with grit for the glory of God the Father.

We often think we have no time for anything, least of all for Jesus, for prayer, but my experience tells me that when we really want something, we always find time for that thing.

We priests often have many commitments, especially at Christmas and Easter, yet every day we do at least 1.5 hours of prayer with even a quarter of an hour of Eucharistic Adoration. One might object: how many things, how much good you could do in that hour and a half, instead of sitting in your room or in church praying? I am convinced that that time of prayer is by far the best used time of the day, because it is a time in which we are with Jesus: without that time, everything else can become a boastful doing. Instead, by being with Jesus, it is He whom we can then bring to people, and not ourselves with our weaknesses.

So my invitation in this new year to everyone, because our time is growing short, is to dedicate a little time each day just to Jesus with prayer and then live all the rest in His company, working as if we were His employees. In this way every moment of our lives will be used as a favourable time for our sanctification and for our happiness.
