## **Spirit of Glory**

Jesus raised his eyes to heaven... So begins the Gospel for this Sunday. It is a moment of solemn prayer, Jesus' 'last words.'

Back in the day, it was fashionable to pooh pooh this kind of language. We said that 'God' is not 'up there' somewhere. Yuri Gagarin, the first Russian astronaut, remarked that if God had been up in the sky he would have seen him - and he didn't. Children of the enlightenment no longer believe in that medieval stuff.

Maybe so. But we all watch football. We see the star player score the winning goal. Then he or she drops to the ground and raises their eyes to the sky. They might not actually think that 'God' is 'up there' – but still, they lift up their eyes to heaven.

We raise our children in a scientific world where causes and effects, the origins of matter and the beginnings of life are accounted for in terms that don't involve any 'transcendent' reality. 'Mystery' is simply something that we don't understand – yet. We know that when we look at the sky we are looking 'out' into a universe, not 'up' to a heavenly location. That culture surrounds us in school, in the media, everywhere. And 'God?' for many, there is no place for that hypothesis in this world.

Yet the sky is still a wonder. By day it can be that radiant blue, by night a deep dark where stars hang like lamps to relieve the gloom. They stimulate our imagination: The Plough, The Great Bear, Orion. The sky liberates the mind from just thinking in dull, earthbound terms. The heavens are a portal for our human imagination. Imagination and faith are closely linked.

Jesus looked up at the sky, as he emerged from his baptism in the Jordan. And from the heavens came the voice announcing his mission 'You are my Son.' Jesus looks up to heaven hours before his arrest as that mission is accomplished: 'Father, glorify your Son.' The disciples gaze into the sky as Jesus is parted from them.

We believe that greater than the sky, further than the farthest galaxies, beyond all time and space and energy and matter, there is the One who speaks to us as 'I AM,' who is not of the Universe, just as the creator is not the created or the craftsperson not the object crafted. To that One, the heavens are the place where the human imagination can give form to faith, shape and image to belief.

Why do you gaze up into heaven? So say the Angels to the disciples at Jesus' Ascension. They, and we, lift up our hearts, for the mission of Jesus is to make heaven on earth.
