Our Church Needs Light

A few weeks ago we changed the lighting system at Holy Cross Church. We now have new lights which are more cost effective and definitely brighter than before.

The first time I celebrated Mass after the works were finished I was astonished. Everything seemed transfigured: the big Crucifix behind the altar and the apse (the space in between the altar and the end of the Church) shined in a new light. The colours are now more luminous, along with the statues and the flowers.

This transformation made me think. Sometimes we complain that the Church (now I mean the body, not the building) is not as we would like her to be: unattractive, unwelcoming, unpopular... And maybe we are right. There is always space for improvement in every human society. But is the Church just a human enterprise?

A few days ago Erik Varden, Bishop of Trondheim in Norway, wrote a letter to the General Chapter of the Order of Cistercians of the Stricter Observance, that is currently convened in general chapter in Assisi. In his letter he says:

The Church is a divine mystery and must be understood as such. When the human element outweighs the divine, the Church does not flourish. Anthropocentrism kills the Church and its life.

These are hard words, but words we need to hear, for we live in a self-centred world. I do not mean thereby that our world is wickeder or vainer than before; only, it has so far distanced itself from any notion of transcendence that the only reference available to it in existential matters is subjective.

It is often assumed that what puts the Church at odds with contemporary society is its ethical teaching. Many cry out for change in this area. Quite apart from the merit of considering what might be a Catholic response to particular, perhaps new problems in ethics (something each age is called upon to do), I consider the assumption false. I do not think the principal scandal is ethical. I think it is metaphysical. The holiness of God! The splendour of his glory, made manifest in Christ through infinitely gracious condescension!

Many times in the last two millennia the Church went through hard times. Every time this has been an opportunity for a renewal. If we look carefully at what really happened, such renewals didn't spring from a change of structures, ethical teachings or organization, but from a change of heart. Renewals were born in the hearts of those who let the light of God and the *splendour of His glory* come in. They didn't change the Church (as we didn't change the crucifix, the altar or the flowers in Holy Cross Church), but they just let the light of the Spirit come in. The Church is already a Holy place, rich in gifts and treasures to discover. We just need to allow the light of the Spirit to come in and illumine them, through our prayer and communion with those who have the same interest.
