

#### The Kingship of Christ

On the morning of January 30<sup>th</sup>, 1649, Kingship in Britain came to an end. Absolute rule, the style of monarchy practised so disastrously by Charles I, fell, even as the royal head tumbled off the block outside the Banqueting House in Whitehall. Our country was changed for ever. We don't have kings like that any more.

The festival of Christ the King originated as a response to the same human claims for absolute power. It was instituted as a response to the rise of populist fascism in Europe between the two world wars of last century. For when we speak of the Kingship of Christ, we speak of a kingship which judges and radicalises all human claims to power, authority and influence.

If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself – the soldiers' mockery both hides and reveals the truth. Jesus says to Pilate: My kingdom is not of this world. That's not an excuse for removing faith from the public square into a privatised devotional bubble. Quite the reverse, Jesus' world reflects his own being as the Incarnate Son of God. Jesus is humanity, this world, transformed, human being taken up into transcendent being and divinised by it. It is both of this world and not of this world.

In Christ, humanity is transformed by being radicalised. Jesus takes his authority and exercises his rule, not by seizing power, but by surrendering it. *He emptied himself*, wrote Saint Paul, assuming the status of a slave, and he was humbler yet, even to accepting death on a cross. Jesus changes power into surrender, lordship into service, so that the world may have new life.

The crucifixion of the Son of Man is the lens through which human beings can see the truth about God and the reality of worship. In the words of the Christian hymn cited by St. Paul in Colossians, Christ is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. In him all things were created in heaven and on earth. Christ says to John the visionary in the Apocalypse, Look! I am making the whole of creation new.

Real transformation, real life, is never the result of enforcement, power-grabbing or revolution. As the penitent thief discovered on the cross with Jesus, it comes through loving union with Jesus the servant King. True life, eternal life, comes about through his memory of us, which is always the gaze of love. Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom. Truly I tell you, this day you will be with me in paradise.


