#### PITY MAY BE EXPRESSED IN THE MOST UNLIKELY OF PLACES

A few months ago I watched, again, the film *The Lady in the Van.* It is based on a book of the same name by Alan Bennett. The story concerns an elderly eccentric woman who appears on the front driveway of a house living in a dilapidated van. The woman has many problems and anti-social habits but the owner of the house grows to like her and tries to help. Well, I cannot boast of the same situation but I can relate the story of *The Man in My Outside Toilet*.

When I was Parish Priest of Newport, Isle of Wight, the fine Georgian Presbytery stood in its own grounds next to an also fine, but plain, Georgian Church of St Thomas of Canterbury. There was a shared garden between the two buildings, and, for the added comfort of the congregation, there were two outside toilets.

One Sunday afternoon I came home to find smoke coming from underneath one of the toilet doors. Out of propriety I knocked on the door and was surprised to hear someone reply rather cheerily, 'Come in!' I opened the door and there on the floor was a "gentleman of the road," in a sleeping bag reading a paper and smoking a cigarette. He was obviously settled for the night. Beside him there were three or four cans of beer. These cans of beer must have been the last of a few more which he had consumed on the way. Before I could say anything he said, 'I've nowhere to go, and this seemed a nice dry place for the night. I will be gone in the morning.' Out of shock rather than compassion I agreed. For the next few months he came regularly about once a week and stayed in the toilet. He was in various stages of drunkenness but there were times when I could talk to him and tried to encourage him to stay somewhere more permanent and to come off the beer. To all this he agreed until one day he said that in the shop opposite the Presbytery he had seen a one-man tent for sale at the bargain price of £15. He asked if I could give him the money. I said that I would give the money to him in the morning. The morning came and I gave the man the money. I watched him as he went out from the garden gate to the shops opposite; I watched him as he walked past the shop with the tent in the window and I watched him as he went into the corner shop and came out with two packs of lager. I was furious. He could see me looking down the street and he cried out in a semi-tearful voice - 'I can't help it.'

A few days later I was able to simmer down and think about what had happened. I felt ashamed that I had not asked about his past life or whether there was a reason for him to be on the streets. I was even more ashamed that I had not shown adequate pity. I had been shown an example of what it is to be angry and hurt by a fellow human being's circumstances. I forgave him and smiled to myself that I had been taught a great lesson.

The 1st Reading last Sunday and Isaiah this weekend talks powerfully about this very subject. How often do we commit the same sins and cry to God - 'I can't help it?' How can I demand mercy from God if I, 'nurse anger against another?' Too many lives have been ruined and peoples destroyed through a lack of pity. The wise writer of the Book Ecclesiasticus writes:

Remember the commandments, and do not bear your neighbour ill-will: remember the covenant of the Most High, and overlook the offence.

I still smile when I think of how God taught me something so essential about pity and forgiveness from the most unlikely of people in the most unlikely of places. Watch out, for no situation is free from the possibility of encountering the presence of God and learning from the experience.
