In the Son of Man, God has been glorified

Last Sunday is talked of as Vocations Sunday. Portsmouth Diocese, like all the Diocese in England and Wales, are always in need of more helpers in the harvest. Please continually pray for Bishop Philip, all his priests, deacons and religious in the diocese, but also that there may be many more people who will hear the call of Jesus to their individual vocations, and answer that call.

Having looked back at the theme of last week's gospel, we now consider this week's gospel. It is traditional that on the 5th and 6th Sundays of the Easter season, the gospel readings are taken from the long discourse which St John tells us Jesus had with the apostles at the Last Supper.

This is very deep teaching, so you must make a special effort to experience and understand that it is also down-to-earth, and helps you to understand your own life.

This year's first extract is the beginning of the discourse. It is in clearly distinct sections:

Verses 31 and 32 are the response of Jesus to the departure of Judas. (He made his choice as we all must, but hopefully we know that when we get it wrong we can go back to Jesus, saying we are sorry and ask for forgiveness.) You may also have difficulty interpreting the word "glorify" which occurs several times. It is a biblical term indicating the victory of God's power. It is significant that "hallowed" in the first petition of the Our Father means the same thing.

In verse 33, Jesus says clearly that he is at a point in his life when he must make his journey alone. The saying is repeated and clarified in *verse 36*, which is not included in this passage, but which you may want to look up in a Bible.

In verses 34 and 35 "the commandment of love", which is the dominant theme of the last discourse, is enunciated for the first time.

The strange and the exotic symbolism of the readings seem far removed from our everyday lives, as we sit in the church pew. So is there any point we can connect with these texts? If we have ever heard a homily or read a story which gave us new heart, or if we have ever been moved at the sight of a tear being wiped from the face of someone in sorrow, then these readings can speak to us. For they are about encouragement. All of us need to know that we are not on our own, and that any words of encouragement that we can find for one another are rarely wasted.
