Quadragesima

As the season of Lent has just begun, it seems only right to me to say a few words on the subject. It is not easy to write something new or special, because we all already know very well the meaning of Lent and more or less also the way of living it. However, for those who are beginning to experience Lent for the first time, either because they have just converted, or because they are rediscovering their faith, I would like to give some tips on the meaning of this period.

First of all, Lent in Latin is called 'quadragesima' and derives from the term 'quaranta', that means 40, because it refers to the 40 days during which Jesus remained in fasting and prayer before the beginning of his public life (see this Sunday's gospel). This period, both for Jesus and for Christians, is therefore intended to prepare for a great event. For Jesus it was his public life, and we can imagine how radically his life changed the moment he started preaching and performing miracles. For us, this great event is the celebration of Easter. Being the most important feast of the year, it is our duty to come to this feast prepared. It is as if we were to run a marathon: certainly to be able to complete it in a dignified manner, we need a period of good training before the race.

How does one "train" to prepare for Easter? Or in other words, how should the Lenten season be spent?

The Church, since the time of St Augustine, has always emphasised the need for three fundamental acts to adequately prepare us to celebrate the passion and resurrection of Jesus: fasting, prayer and charity. A brief explanation of them:

Fasting: recognising that even our basic needs - such as feeding ourselves - become secondary in the face of Jesus: He is more important in our lives than having a full belly.

Charity: we do not live in isolation from others, but in relationships. The most beautiful way of living in relationships is to help each other with their needs, and thus in supporting and helping those around us who are most in need.

Prayer: this is what gives strength and motivation to the previous two activities. For it is only through a close relationship with Jesus lived in prayer that you become capable of giving up what you would like, and doing good for others.

There are many ways of fasting, doing charity and praying: I leave it to you to find the form that best helps you to live this Lent in a holy way, only, when you are thinking about this, keep in mind what Fr. Luca wrote on the previous front page: that will help you to be really prepared to live the passion and resurrection of Jesus to the full.
